The community planning forum is your chance to:


- give your thoughts on local transit service needs in the Southwest Corridor

- talk to staff to catch up on the Southwest Corridor Plan or ask questions.



With the Southwest Service Enhancement Plan – one of the first actions to come out the Southwest Corridor Shared Investment Strategy – TriMet is taking a fresh look at possible improvements to transit service and access in areas like Southwest Portland, Tigard, Tualatin, King City, Sherwood, Durham, Lake Oswego and West Linn.

The Southwest Corridor Plan and Shared Investment Strategy is a comprehensive land use and transportation effort to identify and prioritize public investments in the corridor between downtown Portland and Sherwood.

Building on the local plans, the Southwest Corridor Plan examines high capacity transit alternatives and potential roadway, bicycle, parks, trails and nature improvements.



Southwest Corridor Plan partners: cities of Beaverton, Durham, King City, Lake Oswego, Portland, Sherwood, Tigard and Tualatin, Multnomah and Washington counties, ODOT, TriMet and Metro.
