

2007 Daily VMT (Vehicle Miles of Travel) Update:

The most recent VMT information available is for 2007 (as of 7/21/08). There are two different sets of data for the Portland Area, depending on how the geographic area is defined.

1. Portland-Vancouver, Oregon-Washington Urbanized Area: The first set is designated by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) as the Portland-Vancouver, OR-WA, 'Urbanized Area (UZA 27)'. This includes the Federal-Aid Urbanized Areas of Portland, Oregon and Vancouver, Washington. The 1990-2006 data are from the FHWA, and from the ODOT & WDOT Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS) programs in Salem, OR and Olympia, WA respectively. For 1990-2006, DVMT/Person data can be located in the FHWA publication 'Highway Statistics', Section V, Table HM-72, 'Urbanized Areas - Selected Characteristics,' Publication No. FHWA-PL-06-009. 2. Portland, Oregon ONLY Data: The second geographic area is the Portland portion only of the above noted Portland-Vancouver Area. The source is directly from both the FHWA and ODOT/ HPMS for 1990-2006. The sub-set of information for Portland only is extracted as a separate group of figures. The geographic area of Portland is uniquely defined in the HPMS program as a Federal-Aid Urbanized Area, and includes portions of Multnomah, Washington, and Clackamas Counties. The 2007 data is directly from ODOT & WDOT HPMS offices.

*In 2007, the Portland only Daily Vehicle Miles of Travel was estimated to be 29,185,000 miles, with a population of 1,457,000.
