

Oxbow Regional Park. A 1,200-acre natural area located within the wild and scenic Sandy River Gorge, Oxbow Regional Park offers visitors scenic beauty, recreational diversity and exceptional wildlife habitat. The river draws swimmers, rafters and kayakers and offers anglers some of the best winter steelhead and salmon fishing in Oregon. Enjoy hiking in an ancient forest, mountain biking, horseback riding and wildlife watching. The park's naturalists provide excellent nature education such as mushroom and wildflower identification, bird walks and animal tracking.

To best protect wildlife, **pets are not permitted** in any Metro parks or natural areas.

Camping at Oxbow. Oxbow's 67 wooded campsites are open year-round and available on a "first-come, first-served" basis. Maximum occupancy is six people and two cars per site. Firewood is available for purchase at \$4 per bundle. Camping fee is \$15 per night. There is also a \$4 per vehicle entrance fee to the park on day of entry.



Directions: Oxbow Regional Park is 30 minutes from downtown Portland. From I-84, take the Troutdale exit (17). Go past the truck stop to the light. Turn right on 257th, go 3 miles to Division Street. Turn left onto Division. Follow the park signs 6.5 miles and turn left onto Oxbow Parkway. Follow the road to the park.

Hours: 6:30 a.m. to legal sunset.

Entry Fee: \$4 per car or \$7 per bus.

Annual Pass: \$40; \$30 for seniors.


